Michelle has asked that I pass on some information about the free sessions and support groups that are held in the Children's Centres across the city and invite any of you who feel they might benefit you to come along.
  - Autism Drop In group For families who have a child on the autistic spectrum. Run by the Centre's own autism champion.
  - The Incredible Years A course which helps parents who are encountering behaviour struggles with their children. 2 hours a week for 14 weeks.
  - o Let's Talk An 8 week programme for families who have children with speech and language delays.
  - o Stay and Play Sessions An opportunity to meet and chat with other parents whilst little ones play.
  - o The Freedom Project A programme set up to support those who have experienced domestic abuse.


#### **Coming Up Next Week:**


